During FY2024-25, YOU were the reason why our United Way, the United Way of Washington County, was able to reach the amazing milestone of 100 years of serving those in need in Washington County.

You – our Community Partners – allow us to continue to strengthen our mission – to unite people, resources, and organizations to improve lives in Washington County.

You – our Community Partners – joined us as we supported over 57,000 individuals through our Community Impact Fund addressing the lack of literacy, achieving financial stability, improving both physical and mental health, assisting veterans, and increasing food security.

You – our Community Partners – lent a hand along with other community members to record over 594 hours of volunteer hours. Wow!

You – our Community Partners – helped us address community needs by providing food for neighbors' dinner tables, warm winter coats for students who walk to school, hygiene items for young girls, and essentials for low-income senior citizens.

You – our Community Partners – stepped up when bicycles were built for at-risk youth during the holidays and donated back-to-school supplies and books to distribute to help students learn and improve their literacy level.

During this fiscal year, Community Investment resulted in a total of \$266,750 reinvested in 31 local programs in the areas of education, financial stability, and health. The amount of \$31,515 was raised and redistributed as directed by donor designations. The remaining amount of \$54,963 was distributed to other United Ways' specific programs.

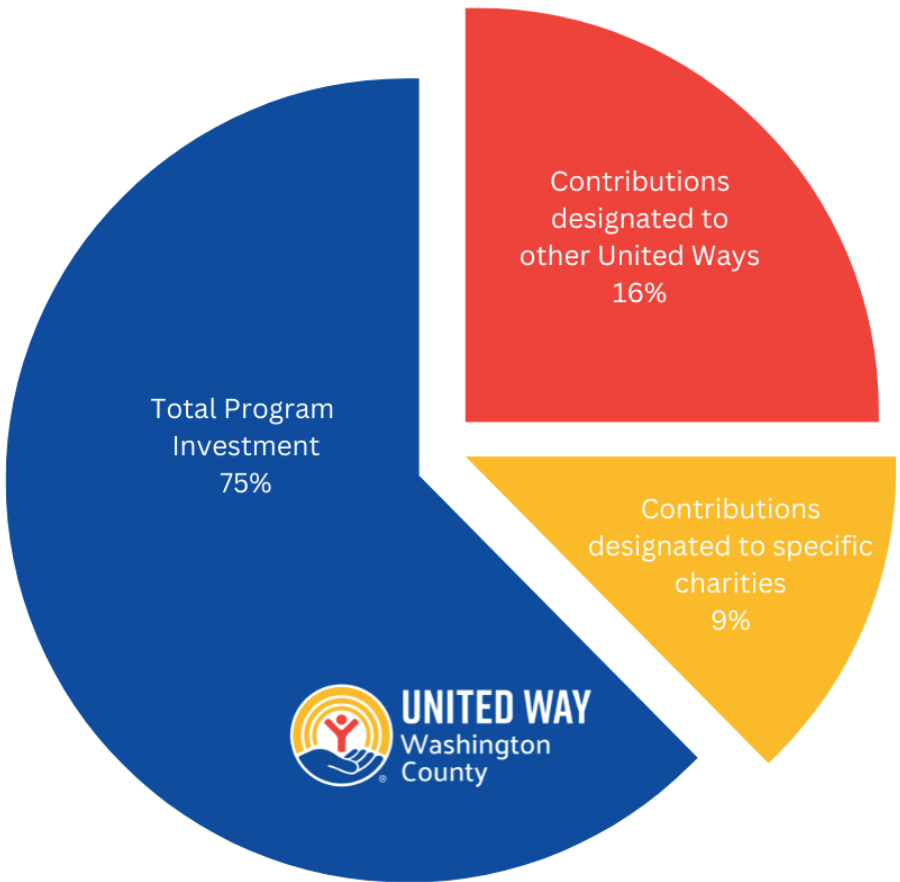

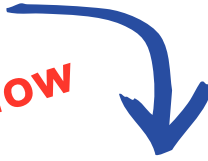
