



Community Members interested in serving on the Board of Directors

For over 100 years, the United Way of Washington & Greene Counties (UWWGC) has been serving those in need in our community. As a leader on the Board of Directors, service is accomplished, first and foremost, by a strong commitment to the UWWGC mission, “to unite people, resources, and organizations to improve lives in Washington and Greene Counties.

Service is divided into duty of care, duty of loyalty and duty of obedience, with board members being positive contributors to the UWWGC. A board member is asked to:

- attend and participate in meetings,
- notify when not available,
- maintain confidentiality, be informed,
- join a committee,
- participate actively in board and committee discussions,
- help raise funds,
- promote UWWGC through professional and personal contacts,
- adhere to signing off on conflicts of interest and Code of Ethics,
- make recommendations for volunteers and board nominees,
- consider participating on the Community Impact Fund Panel,
- attend UWWGC events,
- consider leadership board position,
- be attentive to other comments/concerns,
- ask questions,
- be educated with programs,
- assess board’s performance,
- be accountable, and
- serve as an UWWGC Ambassador in your role as a member of the board of director.

Board Meeting are held every other month beginning in August of each fiscal year on the third Tuesday of the month at 8:00 am in person or via Zoom. Board members are asked to be prepared for the meetings by accessing the board portal located on the UWWGC website for all relevant documents.

Board support is encouraged at events including the annual Campaign Kickoff Golf Outing held at the end of July, Power of the Purse in the Spring, and the Annual Meeting held in June.

The UWWGC is a separate and independent 501(c)(3), one of over 1,000 United Ways in the network under the umbrella of the United Way Worldwide, with its own bylaws and policies governed by an independent board of directors. Given its lengthy history in serving the community, the members of the UWWGC Board of Directors have been and continues to be community focused. Board members take their positions seriously and are committed to ensuring that this local United Way makes an impact in fulfilling its mission in our community in Washington and Greene Counties.
